### **ANNUAL REPORT 2020 - 2021**

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#### **1** Introduction

The period from April 2020 to March 2021 was very difficult for the voluntary sector organisations and civil societies that were playing an important role in the development sector for nation building. Despite various restrictions due to the COVID Pandemic in the country, RGF has undertaken a number of activities such as COVID relief and livelihood, Education through digital medium, conduct a number of webinars on social and economic issues, producing of policy watch papers on various themes, publishing of articles and research papers etc. In addition, we have celebrated birth anniversaries of famous personalities for promoting their ideals and values through our programs and activities.

This was a difficult yet an eventful year for the entire team and the team is full of zeal to carry forward this journey of building and spreading Sadbhavana. The report details out the activities in each of our programs.

#### 2 Livelihoods

#### 2.1 COVID Relief Activities done in collaboration with NGOs

Due to the lockdown crisis, lakhs of people in the informal sector were without work and without food. There was an immediate need for relief support at all places. The only way of providing support was daily need food grains, pulses, cooking oil and essential grocery items. During the lockdown, RGF supported more than 20 NGOs in 12 states for COVID relief work. The NGOs were from the various locations of the states. In some states, we have carried out the relief work by engaging RGF Sadbhavana Associates. Through the NGOs and Sadbhavana Associates, RGF provided food materials to the needy workers who were in transits, daily wage earners, unemployed, homeless people, beggars and low income-group families in the highly affected areas. More than three lakhs people were reached and provided the relief material during the reporting period. Mr Sheikh Bashir Ahmed, RGF Volunteers and his team members


organised a Covid-19 relief distribution camp at various districts in J&K, and distributed dry ration kits to more than 150 families.

get a place to stay.


Mr. Basant Kumar distributed dry ration kits to labour and small washermen families in his

Mr. Manoj Mishra became a part of The National Youth organisations and Utkal Gandhi Smarak Nidhi, where they distributed cooked food to almost 300 people everyday in Cuttack. These 300 people are migrant workers, rickshaw pullers, beggars and destitute women.










#### 2.3 Rajiv Aajeevika Samvardhan Abhiyan (RASA)



Timing: 2.00 pm to 3.30 pm

The Rajiv Aajeevika Samvardhan Abhiyan (RASA) for the rural residents and migrant returnee people was inaugurated on 20<sup>th</sup> August 2020. The RASA initiative aims at reviving the livelihoods of the migrants and residents. This abhiyan is to support the potential entrepreneurs from farm sector as well as non-farm sector to become an Atmanirbhar through capacity building and handholding support. RASA endeavours to stimulate the emergence of about 600 Aspiring Micro-Entrepreneurs (AMEs).

This Livelihood Revival Support Program was launched with 13 NGO/SHG/FPO partners in seven states and 22 districts covering over 600 aspiring micro-entrepreneurs. By the end of March, over 85 percent started microenterprises.

#### The present training methodology is planned with three-fold objective:

- Systematic understanding/ exposure/ awareness of the components enterprise (very small, small and cluster-based) enterprises.
- Understanding of the traits of a very small entrepreneur.
- Planning the entrepreneurs training and handholding in the current situation.

#### At the end of the training we expect participants to have:

- Some knowledge about enterprise, to help them to help entrepreneurs in their enterprise selection, and later on provide bases for hand holding in running the enterprise smoothly.
- Understanding of entrepreneurial traits, which will help them to identify and select entrepreneurs.
- Concretizes the first training of entrepreneurs with special focus on practicality in current situations (covid induced limitations), hence the outcome is a practical action plan of training at field level.

#### 2.4 Reconstruction and Livelihood Restoration at Wayanad District, Kerala

To rehabilitate the most affected families due to heavy rains and landslides in Kerala in 2019, various activities with the involvement of local civil societies, local panchayats, technical agencies and local individuals were planned for reconstruction of broken houses. After several meetings with local agencies and

field visits in villages, assessment and surveys, we identified most affected Adiya Tribal families for resettlement and rehabilitation activities in the panchayat. Under this project, a Model House and a Community Centre were planned for resettlement of tribal families. A model house was completed in Wayanad and training in bamboo handicraft production was carried out in Idukki with NGO partners. The nearly 50 trained tribals were able to make products and sell these through an exhibition as well locally on a regular basis, to augment their earnings.









#### 2.5 Restoration of Livelihood and Skill Development at Wayanad District, Kerala

The project's objective is to provide a recovery mechanism for Tribal communities in Wayanad to realize their livelihood. Specifically, the project addresses an alternative, assisting women to seek a viable activity by developing their skills with better prospects earning a steady supplementary income. Intervention at this juncture means hand holding, by introducing alternative means, for which support is essential. Keeping in mind the need of the families, the following activities have been started in the month of March 2020 in the four selected areas of two blocks in Wayanad District:

Poultry rearing in Cages Goat rearing Rice / Tuber/Plantain etc cultivation (JLG) Revival of cultural troupe of Tribal youth Support for Semi skilled youth- Tailoring



One of the livelihood activities approved was Buffalo calves rearing. They were able to do the initial work in the month of

September 2020. They received five Calves and they prepared a strong buffalo shed. Now they take care of them by cleaning the shed and feeding the buffalo calves as they decided within the small group.

In addition, they will be taking one acre of cultivable land on lease for cultivating string beans; the latter will continue as paddy cultivation.



Our staff member, Ms Cicily Francis visited the program villages to assess the progress of the project. She had a meeting with the youth group and their panchayat member Mr Joseph who has been a great support and guide to them. They formed a youth group of 20 persons who were also the members of a cultural music group. They opened a bank account and did transactions of money to buy buffalo calves for rearing them as a team as they got support from the NGO to continue the livelihood program. A big number of tribal youth groups are very active in the various activities for livelihoods in the region.

One of the activities the youth group perform is their Nasik dolls music and earn for their daily needs. We could see a dynamic and energetic tribal youth group with great goals while they took their livelihood activity.


#### 2.6 Flood Relief and Livelihood Restoration, Jammu & Kashmir

A project titled Actions for Sustainable Livelihoods (ASL) was implemented in flood affected areas of Kashmir, with partnership of Indo-Global Social Services Society (IGSSS). This work began after the 2014 floods, the work has been completed with over 500 households taking up three income generating activities - vegetable and fruit cultivation, sheep rearing and carpet weaving.

Progress made by FPO-OFPO/Artisan/Farmers:

- Eight artisans completed weaving of 192 square feet worth Rs. 2.18L.
- Demonstration sites harvested vegetable crops of Rs 1.54L from knol-khol, Shimla long Radish, pink table radish.
- Two SHGs namely Hamasa & Shama sold 13 quintals of vermi-compost.

- SHEJAAR Vegetable Producer Company sold fresh vegetables like Knol-Khol, Radish, Garlic, Bottle Gourd, Cucumber, Cauliflower, Cabbage, broccoli, lettuce, turnip, Farash beans, Onion & Sukash Bottle Guards worth 125,000 INR.
- Backyard Poultry Model Replication: A part of sustainable and diversified livelihood, 35 progressive livestock producers of Gadakhud and 11 families of Najan and Tularzoo villages of Bandipora district adopted and replicated the previously implemented pilot project on backyard poultry at Najan village.
- Keeping in view the Covid pandemic and subsequent expansion of this model has been realized. The people in and around the Najan village showed their keen interest and took steps forward to explore more opportunities and harness the benefits accordingly under this concept.
- Department of agriculture Sumbal distributed vermi-compost among 40 families at Ankhulla village of Bandipora district (5 kgs each family) free of cost during July under VFPO banner.



Trainings Conducted

- > Use of Virtual Space for Planning and Engagement:
  - 1. A Capacity Building Group and Covid-19 Crisis was created in collaboration with Centre for Law and Development
  - 2. Comprising of 16 members (10 active youth group representatives, three advocates, Greater Kashmir editor & two staff members of IGSSS)
  - 3. Dialogue on conflict transformation and community engagement during COVID-19 crisis in rural areas.
  - 4. Two rounds of virtual engagement meeting conducted on Disasters and Peace Building Opportunities and Organizational Capacity Development.
- > Farmer Field School- Rice Cultivation Technical Trainings:
  - Ten onsite technical trainings for trainees of FFS rice Cultivation with a focus on growing chemical free rice varieties in Ankhulla village of Bandipora district organised.
- ➤ Farmer Club Awareness Meet Program with NABARD support:
  - One awareness meet program of Al-Mustafa (Ankhulla) farmer producer group was organised with the expert Gh Mohd Dar, retired chief agriculture officer.
  - Discussed the services, schemes, and technical inputs available with the department of agriculture.
  - One agri expert met and field with a producer group organised to provide technical inputs on spot to these farmers and future course correction for their transplanted vegetable & rice variety crops.
- KISSAN Pakwada Meet: 200 farmers participated in this meet in three blocks of Sumbal, Pattan and Singpora to get awareness about the KCC and other related schemes from the agriculture department, J&K Bank & other departments online.

Many meetings and interactions were organised such as:

- Interaction Program with Chief Animal Husbandry Officer Bandipora on Sheep husbandry and related government schemes
- Meeting with Agriculture Officers of Sumbal and Pattan zone to provide inputs on the strengthening of the Shejaar FPO & building the capacities of its board of directors and registered members.

In addition, various relief works is done in response to COVID crises such as ration, food distribution, sanitation and awareness

#### 2.7 Water Conservation Structures in Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh

In Karauli district of Rajasthan water harvesting work by Gram Gaurav Sansthan (GGS), a local NGO, continued with funding from both the DS Foundation directly to GGS, and with MGNREGA funding directly to panchayats. Work on several structures completed during the COVID period and it provided both much needed employment as well as built permanent water structures to enhance agricultural area and yield and reduce drought risk.

A project to strengthen women's self-help groups and take up goat-rearing was also started. A project to install solar panels to provide both domestic lighting, water supply and also some irrigation is being planned and is likely to commence in March 2021. Mr Uzair Khan and Mr Murari

Goswami provided technical guidance and RGF has placed a team of three grassroots community mobilizers in the area.

In the Tikamgarh district of Madhya Pradesh, after almost six months of no action due to COVID as well as change in government, by October, some more proposals for building farm ponds under MGNREGA were accepted by the district administration.

#### **3 Education**

#### 3.1 INTERACT

Due to COVID and the closure of schools and colleges, INTERACT children were all at their homes. Ms Sujatha and Ms Vibhuti, along with Ms Diana in Guwahati and Ms Kaneez Zehra and Mr Aijaz Sofi in Kashmir continued to reach out the children through audio and video calls and provided all kinds of support and counselling. To keep the children engaged, programs were organised digitally to educate and entertain them jointly with the Wonderoom team. By March, by enrolling the last six children from Kashmir, we were able to complete the target number of providing scholarships to 300 children.

In the middle of all this, Sujatha was able to secure admissions for seven scholars who had finished 12<sup>th</sup> standard, to join professional courses in the Suresh Gyan Vigyan University, Jaipur with full waiver of tuition fees and some concession in hostel fees. Four scholars were admitted to Renaissance University, Indore with partial scholarships.

The nutrition and hygiene education program to combat Acute Encephalitic Syndrome (AES) in Muzaffarpur, Bihar was restarted by partner NGO Save a Mother Foundation in March.


#### **3.1.1 INTERACT Plus Activities**

We had organized zoom meetings in the month of August with the INTERACT family of Assam and Manipur. The topic in the meetings was "Life during Covid" and everybody shared their experiences. It never felt that all were sitting in different corners of the country. It was like all were sitting together discussing matters like a big family and happy that all are doing their bit to help fellow



human beings.

One more zoom meeting was organized by the RGF Kashmir team regarding Covid-19 and its effects on mental health and how to deal with the situation. The meeting was

attended by eleven present Scholars, four alumni, two guardians and Kashmir Team of RGF with Ms Sujatha and Ms Vibhuti. The following issues were discussed:

• The main objective of the meeting was to inform the

participants about the pandemic situation of Covid-19 and its effects on mental health.

- The participants were made aware about the SoPs and guidelines by the administration to fight against Covid-19.
- Focus on maintaining social distance and work from home was discussed with participants.
- Utilization of existing resources to keep in touch with studies was also explored in the meeting.

- Engagement with indoor games, storytelling and other recreational tasks.
- Phoning counselling in case of any need.
- Information in case of any emergency need of daily essentials.

#### **3.1.2 INTERACT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM**

We give them tasks to draw, paint, craft, dance and share their activities in our whatsapp group. We also make them participate in most of the activities given on the zoom meetings. We have organized 3 zoom meetings with our Wonder World kids in the

month of July and August.

Then on Independence

day, along with Mrs. Uma Lakshman, Principal of Padma Tiny Tots organized the Independence day celebration on Zoom reaching out altogether to the school kids as well as our Wonder World kids who mostly are pass outs from this school. We stay at home to be safe but we reach out to the kids by one way or the other.



3.2 Update from Rajiv Gandhi Cambridge Trust Scholar Devarchan Banerjee:

'Between 2019 and 2020, Devarchan worked in Uganda as a research associate with the Booth School of Business, University of Chicago. He assisted with three nationwide randomised interventions involving 4000 firms engaged in public procurement. The interventions were aimed at reducing information frictions between firms and public procurement agencies. Later, He was promoted to lead the design and implementation of a lab-in-the-field experiment. The experiment measured how firms are disincentivised to be more active in the public procurement market by their perceptions of the corruption of procurement agencies.


Currently, he works for Dalberg Global Development Advisors as an Associate Consultant. A global strategic advisory firm that focuses exclusively on international development. I have advised the Indian Government and three international agencies on preparing a research design to understand the impact of COVID-19 on early childhood development. For the ongoing study, he created a panel survey to be delivered to 10,000 primary, secondary, and institutional caregivers across ten Indian states and conducted several 'Human-



Centred-Design' interviews with institutional caregivers. He has also worked with Jai Vakeel Foundation, India's largest intellectual disability organization to design an innovative Monitoring and Evaluation strategy based on Amartya Sen's Capabilities approach.

#### 3.3 Rajiv Sadbhavana Media Lab (RSML)

RSML has been working under the coordination of Dr Ankush Gupta on engaging social media viewers by creating videos and posters for RGF, RGICS and for Sadbhavana Web portal. Under the program of Interactive Digital Education and Assessment of Learning (IDEAL) - Sadbhavana se Samadhaan (S2S) Platform, the team has engaged a number of children from various parts of the country. The children were approached to register in the platform and engage



themselves in the related activities during the lockdown. In the reporting period, a total of 500 children from different parts have registered at the IDEAL platform of RSML.

Keeping in mind their needs to engage and also to help them think positively, on April 14, 2020, RGF launched a competition titled "Sadbhavana in the Times of Corona". Children in the age group of 8-13 years have made their entries on <u>www.sadbhavana.net</u> on acts, experiences and learning about Sadbhavana around them that they have come across during this time of dealing with Covid-19. This competition also marked the launch of the 'Engage' section of 'Sadbhavana say Samadhaam' (S2S) platform, where children made their profiles, created groups and shared Sadbhavana related content with each other. The competition was open for 14

days (14-28 April 2020). There were cash prizes and two consolation prizes in different age groups for the winners.

The competition was successfully completed. Results announced during a Zoom event on Shri Rajiv Gandhiji's

death anniversary with the children participating and Shri Sandeep Nagar, Dy. Director Education department, Government of Punjab was the Guest.

We started a 76 days long activity on the theme of "Sadbhavana with Nature Festival" on 5th June 2020. The Wonderoom team along with some resource persons delivered various online sessions for this theme. There were a number of sessions on various topics related to Sadbhavana with Nature. During the sessions with children, the importance of Sadbhavana with Nature (Jal, Jangle, Jameen and Jaanwar) was discussed. During this festival,





sessions on various topics related to Sadbhavana with Nature.

During the sessions with children, the importance of Sadbhavana with Nature (Jal, Jangle, Jameen and Jaanwar) was discussed. During this festival, plantation of trees was also done in different locations of the country.



This festival was till the 20th of August, where it ends on Rajiv Ji's Birth Anniversary. We have had a total of 19 sessions on varied topics. Mr. Ashwani, Mr. Namik, Mr. Pratul, Mr. Rajneesh, Mr. Ankush and Mr. Jeet Singh have all taken sessions along with a few external guests. All of

these sessions were taken on Zoom calls which simultaneously went Live on Facebook and were also recorded for future usage. Each session had an average of 40-45 participants.

Apart from regular sessions we had also organized an online speech competition from the 19th June to 28th June 2020. We got a total of about 44 entries, from all over India and the best 10 were chosen by the detailed scoring process done by Mr Ankush Gupta, Mr Arun Malik, Mr Raju Paswan and Ms Vibhuti.









The Finale of the event happened on the 1st of July 2020. A total of 30 sessions were organized under Sadbhavana with Nature Festival including a Plantation Drive as well as inviting various guest speakers from different fields and a two-day program to celebrate author Premchand's birth anniversary.

The sessions were attended by around 130 participants (many of them attending regularly) over Zoom as well as uploaded on Facebook with 1000 views as the average viewership.

The finale was organized and the winners were announced for the online speech competition – 'Covid is caused by Humans Destroying the Environment' and cash prizes and certificates were distributed. The winning entries along with the finalists are available on the platform. Experts on Environment, cinema, yoga, theatre, music and literature spoke on these subjects along with in-house resource persons. Teams from Rajasthan, Kerala, Assam, Uttarakhand, Haryana, Delhi and Kashmir participated in the plantation drive.

Another activity of the summer school 'Research-Oriented Course on Water for Children' was also completed in this period. The online competition 'Nature and Me' was conducted between 15th July to 25th July, 2020.





During the Lockdown, the attendance for fixed time Zoom based events used to be high but it slowly came down. We found that many more people visit the curated programs on Facebook and YouTube. So to make all our programs available in one location, we technically upgraded the earlier platform <u>www.sadbhavana.net</u> and established a new edutainment platform <u>www.sadbhavana.academy</u>.

Satyagraha through Non-Cooperation, and Civil Disobedience, were discussed. A tribute to Bapu, where artists from all over the country came together to perform online, was accompanied by heartfelt renditions and some enlightening discussions. This was followed by a beautiful evening of performances tracing 'The Journey of Mahatma'. Taking a cue from the 'namak satyagrah', a two-part series on salt was also organized by SKILLabs as part of our Wonderzoom program.

RSML team members Dr. Ankush Gupta (filmmaker, theatre director, music composer) and Mr. Nishant Tiwari (cinematographer, editor) conducted a two-day workshop (8-9 October, 2020) **'Script se Screen Tak'** in Varanasi with the puppetry artists from Creative Puppet Theatre Trust in Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh. The workshop was attended by 15 artists that included puppeteers, writers, camerapersons, editors and production designers from the Creative Puppet Theatre Team. The workshop aimed at working with these artists to create content for online platforms and included sessions on scripting, visual language and production design, shot divisions, shooting techniques, and content development. #### 3.3.1 Wonderzoom Sessions

The Wonderoom team has been very active digitally. We offer three main activities spread across different sessions: Fun Science, Art & Craft and Theatre.

Wonderoom organised a number of online sessions under Wonderzoom with children covering many states. There were different sessions on diverse issues such as science and environment, health, education, arts and crafts, theatre, stories etc. The team also organised various counselling sessions for children on reducing mental and physical stress as well as session for improving English language and understanding about important aspects of physics.

The team contacted more than 7000 children in different states for attending the Wondezoom online session on various skills development aspects and information. During the period, we have organised more than 300 sessions on zoom for children. On an average, around 60-70 children attended each session. In total, around 4000 children participated during online zoom sessions from 16 states. The states are Delhi, Rajasthan, Harvana, Himachal Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Bihar, Jharkhand, Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh, Assam, Manipur, Nagaland, Jammu & Kashmir, Karnataka, Kerala and Telangana.







#### Brief about the online workshop

Mr. Ashwani Masih and Mr. Namik Sherpa delivered various sessions on fun science and arts and craft activities. Skill lab children made the tippy tap, a hand washing machine using waste material. Keeping the Corona situation in mind, it will be helpful in washing hands without touching the soap and tap.



Aimed at providing reading, writing and arithmetic learning opportunities to slum children, the **Antyodaya Shiksha Abhiyan (AShA)** was launched on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2021 under the guidance of Shri Ajay Sahai, a Gandhian social worker and the leadership of Shri Parmanand Bhatt, with support from staff members Ms Geeta, Ms Anju Sharma, Mr Vinod Sharma, Mr Pratul Vasistha, Mr Madhaw, Mr Wahid, Mr Rajesh Verma, Mr Suresh Pal, Mr Sushil Kumar and Mr Anoj Kumar. By the end of February, 15 centres were run in Delhi and NCR. By the middle of March another 10 centres were established in Rain Baseras run by an NGO, SPYM. The program will be expanded.



3.5 Law Scholars program for Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya students



With the motivational support of our Associate Mr Anoop Maurya, himself an alumnus of Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya (JNV), Baharaich, UP, a Law Scholars program was launched for selected 35 students of 12 Standard from various Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya (JNVs) in Uttar Pradesh. They were provided residential coaching to prepare for the Common Law Admission Test with the aim that some talented, underprivileged children may get into the top level schools in India. This program was carried out in collaboration with the Bharat Navodaya Institute, which is an alumni association of JNV students run by Mr Anoop Maurya.









# 4 Sadbhavana – Heritage Outreach and Public Engagement

4.1 Memories and Archives of Rajiv Gandhi (MARG)

An online exhibition 'Rajiv's World: The World of Nature' was curated by MARG on the occasion of the 76th Birthday of Shri Rajiv Gandhi from 20<sup>th</sup> August to 31<sup>st</sup> August 2020.

The work of cataloguing various archival material – photographs, videos, documents, etc. - and digitising it as well as adding metatags to make it searchable, which was the main activity undertake during the Lockdown period by MARG staff Mr Pankaj Kumar and Ms Pratibha Gautam working from home, continued after October. The software Sanchay has become dated and we decided to port the data to a new web based platform



to make it easily searchable. The technical support for this is being provided by Mr Varun Chandra and IT professionals.

Unfortunately due to a notice served by the Land and Development Office on the Jawahar Bhawan, the ceiling of the new MARG Gallery had to be removed and that required the exhibits to be dismantled. While many of the exhibits have been saved for reuse, some will have to be made again.

We have resolved to restore the gallery to its earlier status in the coming year, with the help of exhibition designer Ms Vasundhra Sangwan who had designed MARG earlier.









Rajiv Sadbhavana Abhiyan was organised from 16<sup>th</sup> August to 20<sup>th</sup> August 2020 in loving memory of Shri Rajiv Gandhi. This run started from Jawahar Bhawan and covered Veer Bhumi to India Gate to 10 Janpath to Indira Gandhi Memorial and ended at Jawahar Bhawan. Ms Sufiya, a Guinness World Record holder runner for peace, led this run. The Sadbhavana Pledge ceremony was conducted at the Jawahar Bhawan on the culmination day and it was led by Shri Suman Dubey, Trustee, RGF.

Sadbhavana Abhiyan with the theme Sadbhavana se Samadhan Run across Delhi-NCR from the 10th November to 19th November. The run was also led by Sufiya, a Guinness record holder runner. She was then joined by youngsters to spread the message of Sadbhavana se Samadhan (finding solutions to problems with empathy and run mutuality). This covered Faridabad, Ghaziabad, Sonipat,

Bahadurgarh, Noida, Gurgaon and Delhi over eight days. Support for this event was provided by our media consultants Noughts and Crosses.

RGF also sponsored The Golden Quadrilateral Run. Sufiya covered a 6000 kms long run in over 135 days. Sufiya was the 'First and Fastest Female' to cover India Gate to Gateway of India by running in 29 Days, 01 Hours and 11 Minutes. She covered this run in just 125 days.





#### 4.3 Skill Training Program on Digital Technology for Persons with Disabilities (PwDs)

Due to the COVID pandemic and funding constraints, we could not carry out the Sadbhavana Vahan Pradan Karyakaram for Physically challenged individuals on Rajiv ji's birthday this year. This has been RGF's one of the main activities under the "Access to Opportunity" (ATO) Program for Persons with Disabilities (PwDs).

The Skill Training on Digital Technology Program for 100 PwDs was inaugurated on Sadbhavana Divas on 20th August 2020 at Jawahar Bhawan. Mr T D Dhariyal, Ex Commissioner for PwDs, Government of NCT of Delhi were the chief guests. There were other participants like CEO and program team from RGF, representatives from partner NGO, and more than 30 identified PwDs.

After a study on COVID impacts, we came to know that most of the PwDs were facing unemployment problems, especially those who were employed or engaged with the private and informal sector enterprises.





We decided to support a total of 100 PwDs in 2020-21 by providing digital training on information technology, computer skill sets and productivity digital tools to enhance their skills, employability and access to opportunity. For this, we conducted a survey of ATO past beneficiaries who are students and located in 14 states. A total of 86 student PwDs were listed who were supported by RGF with a vehicle in the past during the last five years. The survey was based on need assessment, their interest for training, availability of tools, their availability for training etc. Out of 86 students, a total of 42 students were identified and selected for the training program.



The program is being carried out in partnership with NGO Saral Services in which a total of 143 PwDs candidates were trained on the topics. There were two batches and a three months course was designed for each batch. For a three months course, there were 36 lecture classes on 20 different digital tools. The course aims to build digital literacy of the candidate to a level that they can manage their life and work much better and faster.

#### **5** Rajiv Gandhi Institute for Contemporary Studies

Rajiv Gandhi Institute for Contemporary Studies (RGICS) is the Foundation's policy think tank working on contemporary issues in India. In the year 2020-21, the activities of RGICS were reviewed and reconstituted into five main themes:

**5.1 Constitutional Values and Democratic Institutions**- This theme focuses on gender, caste and marginalized sections of society within the larger ambit of social justice and equity. This theme explores through research and policy analysis, various contemporary dynamics related to issues of justice, equity, equality and communal harmony.

**5.2 Growth with Employment-** The reforms of 1985 and 1991 placed India on a high-growth trajectory. However, India is still one of the poorest countries on earth. To ensure better lives for our citizens, we need to sustain a consistently high growth rate for several decades.

**5.3 Governance and Development-** In the long term, the institutions of a country are perhaps the greatest determinant of its growth and development. Institutions are the "rules of the game in a society"; they determine incentives and outcomes in all spheres of human life.

**5.4 Environment, Natural Resources and Sustainability-** This theme focuses on contemporary issues related to climate change, sustainability and natural resources especially water, forest and land. Our work on these issues attempts to analyze policies and their implementation from people's perspective, their experiences and learning.

**5.5 India's Place in the World-** In an increasingly connected world, the nation-state is less sovereign today that it was ever before. Some of the most consequential issues today – climate change, terrorism, international trade, or global violations of human rights – cannot be dealt by any country in isolation.

#### **Our Discourse Partners-**

In RGICS, we engage with a variety of discourse partners. This is born out of our conviction that public policy should be inspired and shaped by what is happening on the ground. Our discourse partners are:

- Members of Parliament
- Policy makers civil servants, technocrats, regulators
- Policy takers users, providers
- Narrative opinion leaders- media, academia, civil society
- The common public citizens groups

The team has produced various research reports and policy watch documents and held webinars on the issues of interest of the general public. In addition, strategy papers for establishing a high tech power electronics manufacturing hub in Chhattisgarh were also prepared in this period.

#### **Position Paper on SiC based Semiconductors**

- A detailed research study was undertaken by members of RGiCS, FICCI (Ms. Eittee Gupta, Ms. Aishwarya), , along with inputs from CHiPS - Chhattisgarh IT Promotion Society (Mr. Karan Talreja, Mr. Praveen Sambani) with active advice from Prof. Yee Shee Chang , led to an initial; position paper to evaluate the possibility of SiC based Manufacturing Hub in India in Sep 2019.
- Subsequent to the release of the position paper, FICCI had organised an interaction with key investors from Europe and United States, along with industry experts in India to evaluate the SiC opportunity.
- The paper also was subsequently updated with the revised opportunities for various applications.

#### Research Study on National Electronics Policy (2012 and 2019)

- In-depth reading of the National Electronic Policy 2012 (NEP 2012), and progress made under the various schemes of the policy, and readings from Online literature available (i.e. Govt. websites, B2B Electronics magazines, Academic literature, Policy researchers). A similar study was also undertaken on the New policy i.e. NEP 2019 with a focus on key objectives, schemes and additional focus areas over NEP 2012.
- A specific research on the status of Chattisgarh in Electronics was also done through online research (i.e. Govt. websites, media articles, etc.).

#### Discussion with Key officials to explore Hi Tech manufacturing in Chhattisgarh

- A discussion with Mr. Praveen Sambani, Ernst & Young advisor to CHiPS was also done to understand the progress and status of Hi Tech manufacturing in Chhattisgarh, and the progress made under the National Electronic Policy.
- Inputs from Prof. Rajat Moona, Director IIT Bhilai were sought on his expert opinions to set up a High Tech manufacturing facility in Chhattisgarh, and the support from IIT Bhilai required for the set up.
